## Why Proper Waste Management Matters

Improper waste disposal causes pollution, spreads disease, and blocks drainage systems. It affects our environment and health.

## Types of Waste

- Organic Waste: Food, leaves, animal droppings.
- Recyclables: Plastics, glass bottles, paper.
- Hazardous Waste: Batteries, chemicals.
- Non-recyclables: Dirty plastics, ceramics.

1. Sort Waste:
